The Northumbria Police Strategic Independent Advisory Group (SIAG) is a group of independent volunteers who offer constructive appraisal to the Police on its strategies, policies and services. Acting as a critical friend, SIAG is a vital strand of community consultation and engagement.

An exciting opportunity now exists for you to be part of this valued group. We are looking for people from a broad range of communities with different knowledge, skills, experience and perspectives. We particularly want to attract people who reflect the interests of Black Asian and Ethnic communities LGBTQ+ community, people with physical disabilities and Neurodiversity, travellers and gypsies, faith communities and migrant workers.

The role of members

As a SIAG member your community views will help Northumbria Police continue to build stronger relationships with diverse communities whilst also improving the services we deliver. You will be required to:

- Consider proposals and offer suggestions about how to do things better based on your own personal experiences as well as those of your community.
- Consider relevant management information and offer an interpretation of underlying community issues.
- Identify opportunities to network and build partnerships with other organisations and communities.
- Act as a community advocate for the police and the Police and Crime Commissioner and feedback any community issues.

Candidates must be able to:

- Critically appraise organisational policies, practices and procedures.
- Provide constructive feedback on sensitive issues and offer recommendations on possible improvements
- Maintain the highest level of discretion and confidentiality when dealing with sensitive information. Successful candidates will be vetted.
- To attend a minimum of 6 meetings a year as well as those called in response to critical incidents.
 Candidates must reside temporarily or permanently, or have connections with the Northumbria Police area.
